This community has been so helpful and welcoming.... I joined the mentor progra as a mentee a couple of years ago and it turned out I knew more than I thought, but next to other colleagues working in the field for 30 years, I has kind of the impostor syndrome I guess. Since day 1 I been helping students from non Spanish spekaing countries (which is a huge part of the world let me say...) and thanks to that I got a grasp of the different education systems, backgrounds, recognitions, needs... To the point that I'm the "person" to ask within my uni when there are questions.

I coordinate a team of 9 people divided in differente continent's and the first thing I learnt was to help them one by one. Each of them has it's own circumstances, so I believe a relationship based in communication and trust is key for our common development.

I work at the Admissions Service. And service is the main word there. We are here to serve, to help, to give back.

I've trained the new incorporations, I keep weekly meetings with each of them and biweekly with all from the same region. I go to visit them at least once a year. Feeling the support and attention even from the distance it's really important.

Empathy, listening, taking their expertise on their region into account, making decisions together, building trust and creating strategies together...

After all, we are a team!

We could create regional working groups by topics, so members can share their expertise and develop projects together. We could create a shared digital resource hub with training materials, even recordings, regional data...
