I understand the Founding Regional Representative role as a bridge between International ACAC and members in our region — someone who advocates for regional needs, amplifies local voices, and fosters collaboration across cultural and institutional boundaries. This position is about building strong connections, ensuring members feel represented, and creating pathways for active engagement in the organization's initiatives.

My priority areas would be:

Community Building – Creating inclusive spaces for members to connect, exchange best practices, and support one another professionally.

Mentorship and Leadership Development – Matching experienced professionals with emerging leaders to strengthen skills and confidence within the region.

Visibility and Advocacy – Promoting the region's unique perspectives and contributions within the broader International ACAC network.

My vision for the region is a vibrant, well-connected community where professionals feel empowered to share knowledge, collaborate on solutions, and champion equitable access to international education. I see the Regional Representative role as a catalyst for turning isolated networks into a unified voice that both supports local needs and contributes meaningfully to the global conversation.

I anticipate challenges such as varying levels of engagement, geographic distance, and differing institutional priorities. To address these, I would propose innovative solutions including:

Regional Virtual Forums – Quarterly online gatherings for updates, idea-sharing, and problem-solving.

Micro-Networks – Smaller, interest-based or country-specific subgroups to strengthen peer-to-peer support.

Recognition Spotlights – Regularly highlighting members' achievements and contributions through newsletters or social media, fostering pride and participation.

I value many of the current International ACAC practices, such as the commitment to

professional development and the open communication channels between members and leadership. My goal would be to enhance these by tailoring approaches to our region's context, ensuring they are accessible, relevant, and culturally responsive.

Through collaboration, creativity, and consistent communication, I believe we can create a regional network that not only thrives locally but also enriches International ACAC's global mission.

One critical issue I would prioritize is increasing equitable access to reliable, up-to-date information on international admissions pathways for students and schools in the region. Many talented students are eager to pursue higher education abroad but face barriers due to limited guidance resources, inconsistent communication from institutions, or misunderstandings about requirements, timelines, and financial aid. This gap not only impacts students' opportunities but also affects institutions seeking diverse, well-prepared applicants from our region.

The significance of this issue lies in its direct connection to equity. When only those with strong existing networks or personal resources can access accurate information, we unintentionally limit the diversity of perspectives in international classrooms. By improving access to clear, accurate, and culturally relevant guidance, we can open doors for more students — including those from underrepresented communities — to pursue global opportunities confidently.

To address this, I would focus on three key actions:

Information Hubs – Develop a centralized, region-specific digital resource in collaboration with International ACAC, highlighting admissions requirements, scholarship opportunities, and timelines from a wide range of institutions.

Training for School Counselors and Educators – Partner with universities and global organizations to offer webinars and workshops, ensuring those advising students have current, accurate knowledge.

Student & Parent Engagement – Create accessible outreach initiatives, including translated materials and virtual Q&A sessions, to make information understandable for all audiences.

Collaboration would be essential. I would engage regional schools, local education authorities, universities, and global partners within International ACAC to contribute expertise, verify resources, and co-host events. This shared approach would ensure the work is sustainable, culturally relevant, and widely adopted.

By championing transparent, equitable access to admissions information, we would not only

empower students to make informed decisions but also help institutions connect with a broader and more diverse talent pool — strengthening international education for everyone involved.
