ESOS ACT

- ❖ All education providers must be registered (***look for a CRICOS code***)
- ❖ Education providers provide accurate and transparent information on all documents or online materials aimed at international students
- ❖ Transparency: Course details, Entry Requirements, Fees, Career Outcomes, Application Process, Campus Locations, Dates, Pathways (***see this on websites***)
- ❖ Partnerships: Education Agents, Joint Degree Programs, Pathway Providers (***websites***)
- ❖ Fees: Education providers maintain a student account and only receive required tuition and related fees; Students have access to the account to view their balance and upcoming fees
- ❖ Non-compliant providers may be warned, suspended or cancelled!

TUITION PROTECTION SERVICE (TPS)

Assistance for students in case of a default by either the student or the education provider

- ❖ Student Default: Not starting an enrolled course, Withdrawal, Failure to pay, Breach of visa, Misbehaviour
- ❖ Education Provider Default: Closed business, Failure to start a course, Stop offering a course part-way through
- ❖ Options:
 - ❖ Alternative Course to continue studying
 - ❖ Refund of unspent tuition fees

- OR a minimum overall score of 176 (no score less than 169) on C1 Advanced (formerly Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English) **or** C2 Proficiency (formerly Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English)
- OR an overall score of 58 in the Pearson Test of English (Academic) with no score less than 50.

English test results must be no more than two years old.
