The Basics

- Minimum Requirements:
 - 3.0 Minimum GPA (3.4 for non-CA residents)
 - A-G Core Academic Courses
- One application for all UC campuses
 - \$80 per campus for domestic students (\$95 for international)
- Select the major you are most interested in as your primary major
 - Alternative majors may not be considered

Holistic Review

- We consider all achievements, both academic and non-academic
- No single attribute or characteristic guarantees the admission of any applicant to UC Berkeley
- Entire application is read at least twice
- Berkeley is test-free and letters of recommendation are not required

Stand Out in Your Application

- Your personal insight questions are a way for us to get to know you.
 Tell us your story.
- Extracurricular activities show us your passions, your consistent involvement, and your leadership engagement
 - Activities, Awards, Volunteer, Employment, special programs, and non-A-G coursework from 9th–12th grade
- Use the Additional Comments section to include any additional context important to understanding you as a student

International Admissions

- We have international specialists who ensure you receive a fair review.
- We require a minimum 3.4 GPA for non-CA residents.

- Most international students must demonstrate English Proficiency by earning a required score in one of these exams:
 - IELTS: 6.5 or higher | TOEFL: 80 or higher | Duolingo: 115 or higher












Where Our International Students Transfer



What kind of student might be a good fit for a California Community College?

- Parents have concerns about financing 4 years of study in the US.
- A student who didn't gain admission into first choice schools
- A student who doesn't have the GPA to get into a UC year one.
- May need remedial classes or have to repeat a course
- Smoother transition into college life. May need more pastoral and individual care
- Not sure what UC- CSU major is the best fit
- Lower English level requirements
- Gap Year wants a break to explore options or is unsure of what to study

Transfer Admissions Basics to UC

- UC uses a comprehensive review process.
- General education, units, GPA, and major preparation are most important.
- Only one application for nine UC campuses.
 - \$80 per campus for domestic students (\$95 for international)
- Letters of recommendation are not required/accepted.
- Your personal insight questions are a way for us to get to know you. Tell us your story.

Comprehensive Review

- While you can be most competitive by excelling in the academic areas, no single attribute or characteristic guarantees admission.
- We recognize a wide range of talent that may not be reflected in traditional measures of academic achievement.



TRANSFER GUARANTEE

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA

TRANSFER ADMISSION GUARANTEE TAG program guarantees admission to a participating UC for meeting a minimum GPA & major course requirements.

CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY

ASSOCIATE DEGREEFOR TRANSFER The ADT guarantees admission to a Cal State campus by completing an associate degree from a California community college.



NORMALIZING TRANSFER

30% and 40% of UC and Cal State enrollment are transfers, majority coming from California CC's

California law requires UC to guarantee transfer credit from California Community Colleges through articulation agreements, IGETC, and senate bills, ensuring a clear pathway for transfer students.

Transfer Support: Transfer Center, transfer fairs, application workshops, transfer tracking portals

Minimum Transfer Requirements

- 60 semester/90 quarter UCtransferable units
- The UC minimum GPA is 2.4, UC Berkeley requires 3.0 minimum
 GPA in all UC-transferable coursework
- IGETC and 7 course pattern



Minimally Competitive

- 3.00 UC-transferable GPA in all UC-transferable coursework
- 60 UC-transferable semester (90 quarter) units
- ALL General
 Education/Breadth
 requirements and most
 major prerequisites
 completed

Highly Competitive

- Strong GPA
- Sustained academic achievement or upward grade trend
- ALL major prerequisites completed
- Strong major prerequisiteGPA
- Strong responses to PIQ
- Activities, employment, volunteer service, awards

Also

- Letters of Recommendation are not required.
- Berkeley is test-free and letters of recommendation are not required.



Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG)

What is TAG?

A guarantee of admission to a participating campus and major, so long as all deadlines and requirements are met.

To be eligible, students must:

- √ Transfer from a California community college (CCC)
- √ Complete over half of their units at the CCC
- √ Last attend a CCC before transfer

We're thrilled that you are considering attending Diablo Valley College (DVC). As a student of <u>DVC</u> you will have the opportunity to secure guaranteed transfer admission to the University of California, Davis. UC Davis, ranked 9th in the nation among public universities, is a top research university that can offer you many opportunities and prepare you for a career in the United States, your home country or anywhere else in the world.

The Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) program offered through DVC is your guaranteed pathway to UC Davis in the major of your choice. It is a formal agreement that outlines the courses you must complete and the grade point average that must be earned before transferring. To be considered for admission to UC Davis as a transfer student under a TAG agreement, you will need to meet the following guidelines:

- Complete at least 30 UC transferable semester units at the time the TAG is submitted at https://uctap.universityofcalifornia.edu/students/
- 2. Meet the minimum transferable GPA (3.20-3.40 depending upon your major).
- Be a registered full-time student at the time the TAG is written and during your last semester prior to transfer.
- Complete all courses required for admission as well as any necessary major preparation classes by the end of spring semester for fall admission.
- 5. Complete a total of 60 transferable units by the end of spring semester for fall admission.
- Submit an official UC admission application within the appropriate deadline. For the chosen major of Computer Science.

Your transfer agreement will help you meet your undergraduate coursework requirements at DVC and ensure your guaranteed admission as a junior-level transfer student to UC Davis. I encourage you to contact a DVC counselor or visit the Undergraduate Admissions website for UC Davis at admissions.ucdavis.edu/tag for more information after you have been admitted to Diablo Valley College. We also look forward to being in touch with you once you arrive in California.

We wish you much success in your preparation to attend Diablo Valley College and look forward to helping you reach your educational goals here in the United States.

The Basic Requirements to Transfer

Complete 60 semester credits before transfer

- 30 credits per academic year
- or 24 per year + summer school

Complete your General Education requirements

Complete your premajor requirements

All students must complete 2 semesters of English

- English 123 composition
- English 126 literature

GPA to transfer depends on the major and university

- UC Berkeley and UCLA— wants to see close to a 4.0
- UC Davis around 3.2 or 3.3
- CSU San Francisco State 2.0 to 2.3

UC only accepts transfers in the Fall. Many CSUs in the Fall or Spring

IGETC – Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum are the general education courses that California community college students need to complete to fulfill lower division (year 1 and 2 of the Bachelor) at UC or CSU.



IEGTC courses - are accepted by most majors at UC and all CSU's



In addition to IGETC courses, you will need to complete your premajor courses also. The Arts, Theatre and Architecture will require a portfolio also.



Remember – general education courses transferable to UC or CSU many vary.

For example.....

UC requires 1 year (2 semester) of a foreign language, CSU does not.

UC will only accept math courses from College Calculus and above, CSU may accept pre-Calculus such as College Algebra and Trigonometry.

Note: The **CSU GE-Breadth** (California State University General Education-Breadth pattern) is a set of courses that California community college students can complete to fulfill the lower-division general education requirements for the **California State University (CSU) system** before they transfer



ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- NO SAT or ACT for admission to community college
- NO SAT or ACT needed to transfer to another institution *No SAT or ACT score is required for students who have sufficient credits/units to qualify as transfer applicants. This varies by institution.
- 1. No Application Fee for most community colleges
- 2. Evidence of Secondary/High School Graduation (if under 18)
- 3. Evidence of English Language Proficiency
- 4. Financial support evidence (approximately \$29,000)
- 5. Passport copy
