Mentee: Priscilla Kong, Admissions Officer (Barnard College, NY)

As someone who's still relatively new to international admissions and higher education in general, the Mentor Year Program has been a huge source of support to me this year! I feel very grateful to have gotten to work with Brett as my mentor throughout the past several months. Even though our work lives are always busy, it means a lot that we've made a mutual commitment to meet for even one hour every month. During our meetings, we've been able to check in regarding different parts of the admissions cycle, with Brett sharing her expertise, tips, and encouragement on everything from recruitment travel to reading applications! It's also been helpful to have such a consistent connection with someone in the field of admissions who's outside of my institution, allowing me to gain insights from colleagues at other institutions and not just my own. This admissions cycle has been my first year serving as a territory manager for international territories (China, Hong Kong, and Taiwan), so it's been very helpful learning from Brett's insights working with applicants and counselors from these regions specifically.

In our mentorship relationship, we've also gotten to talk about specific goals as well as bigger picture career goals. I knew I had a goal of building more confidence when giving presentations, and that's something we've been able to practice together. We've also gotten to talk about career trajectories and what it's like to work in the field of admissions at a mid-career level, and I've greatly appreciated these insights as an early-career professional.
