Why Canada? High quality education

Public vs. Private

- Approx 100 universities, almost all public, funded by provincial governments
- Provincial accrediting bodies consistent, high-quality education across the country
- Canadian education recognized globally
- Highest proportion of population with a post-secondary credential in the G7





Why Canada? Post-study work opportunities

- Opportunities to study and stay
 - Three-year open post-graduate work permit (PGWP)
 - Part-time work during academic terms (24 hours/week, Increased in November 2024)
 - Co-op, internships, Work Integrated Learning






Why Canada? Unique university experience

Experience of a lifetime

- Four seasons of adventure
- Small (primarily undergraduate), midsize, research intensive options
- Emphasis on fit vs. rankings
- Two official languages: English and French
- High quality education across the country





Immigration policy changes timeline

Financial requirement increase (Dec '23) Caps on study permits (Jan '24) Provincial Attestation Letters (PALs) (Mar '24) PAL required for K-12, transferring between DLI (Nov '24)

















Temporary pause on study permit processing (Jan '24) Removal of PPP (Jan '24)

Adjustments to PGWP for college programs (Nov '24) Adjustment to federal allotments (Nov '24)



Financial requirement for study permit



In December 2023, the financial requirement to obtain study permit(visa) was increased to align with cost of living.

Previous: Tuition + \$10,000 CAD

Current: Tuition + \$20,635 CAD



Further Reduction & PALs

Additional 10% reduction planned, capping approvals at 437,000; 550,162 PALs allocated

Caps on study permits



Public – Private Partnerships



Graduates of programs delivered through public-private curriculum are no longer eligible for Post-Graduation Work Permits (PGWPs) -May 15, 2024.


PGWP eligibility is listed on DLI webpage.

These changes did not affect Canadian Universities and helps to enhance the quality of Canada's education brand.











Provincial Attestation Letters (PALs)

Required for Most Students

Needed for new study permit applications and extensions.

Includes Students in Canada

Secondary school/language training students in Canada require a PAL to change schools or levels of study.

PAL Deposit

Deposit is needed to obtain a PAL and is paid after a student has received an offer of admission and accepted the offer.

LOA Accompaniment

The PAL is included with the Letter of Acceptance in the study permit application.



PAL Required for DLI Change

Changing your school or program



New process for post-secondary study permit holders

Starting November 8, 2024, you must be enrolled in the designated learning institution (DLI) named on your study permit. This means you can no longer change DLIs by letting us know through your online account. To change DLIs, you need to get a new study permit by <u>applying to extend</u> your current one.

PAL Required for:

- ✓ Secondary to College/University
- ✓ ESL/Prep to College/University
- ✓ College to University

- ✓ University to University
- ✓ University to College
- ✓ Undergrad to Graduate (same university)
- ✓ Extensions (potentially)



Adjustments to Post-Graduate Work Permit (PGWP)





Bachelor's, Master's, and Doctoral Programs

Offers 3-year PGWP eligibility across all fields of study.



College Programs

Provides PGWP eligibility only for specified fields of study, with the length depending on the program duration.



DLI Webpage

Lists eligible institutions for PGWP



Full-Time Status

Requires students to maintain full-time status during each semester of study.



Language Proficiency

Mandates English or French proficiency with minimum Canadian Language Benchmarks.



Apply with conditional admission


Start IRCC application once the offer has been accepted and PAL issued

Schedule biometrics ASAP

Required for new study permit applications

Many universities are partnered with BorderPass to help streamline the study permit application process




Medical exams

Key Takeaways

- The introduction of caps and PALs has not reduced availability of undergraduate opportunities for international students.
- IRCC has committed to the value of bachelor's level studies in public Canadian universities by keeping PGWP for all fields of study and institutions.
- Changes to financial cost of living requirements is helping to reduce the burden on institutions and the asylum crisis IRCC is facing. This amount had not changed since the early 2000's and better reflects the expectations of the cost of living.
- Canada remains 'open for business' with lots of capacity for international students.
