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WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE HIGHLY SELECTIVE?



31 out of 1,613 four-year colleges and universities admitted fewer than **10% of applicants in 2021. These institutions are highly selective:**

- Institutions where 10% or less of the applicants are admitted
- Institutions that receive more applications than there are spots available
- Institutions with a holistic approach to application review
- Institutions with no magic formula for admission (no cut-offs or ceilings)
- Institutions where fit academic, intellectual, personal, social, and sometimes demonstrated interest – plays an important role in admission



ADMISSION IS SELECTIVE, NOT JUST COMPETITIVE. WHY?

VERY SELECTIVE (15 - 30%)

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IS IT AN EXACT SCIENCE?



HOLISTIC REVIEW

- Each institution has set priorities that guide how they build a class
- Universities tend to share their overarching priorities within their strategic plan
- Can change from year to year

Why are holistic admission decisions difficult to predict?

- Decisions are based on institutional priorities and goals.
- The evaluation is both objective and subjective.
- Each year is different.

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Which application(s) should your students fill out?

- The Common Application
- The Coalition Application
- University Specific Applications

Encourage students to fill out everything in the application, in detail!

Utilize additional/optional components if your students wish to provide further context not found elsewhere.

- Additional Information/Statement
- Community Disruption Essay
- Admission Interviews
- Resume







HOW TO BEST GUIDE YOUR STUDENTS.



Actionable Insights

- Help parents and legal guardians of your students understand their role in the college search process.
- Advise students to self-reflect as they review their current activities and goals – what's important to them?
- Explore colleges and universities create and maintain a relationship with admissions officers.
- Learn more about access and pre-college and college visit programs.
- Understand admissions terminology and lingo.
- Evaluate class profiles to aid in your advising (counseling to submit scores based on percentiles)
