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## **Concept Based Learning** - University Advising - University Collaboration

→ Concept-Based Learning focuses on understanding broad concepts

 $\rightarrow$  This approach helps students develop critical thinking, adaptability, and a deeper understanding of subjects.

 $\rightarrow$  Counselors can integrate these skills into University Advising, aligning with university expectations and programs.

→ High school -Uni collaboration ensures students are well-prepared



## **Applying Concept-Based Learning in University Advising**

#### **Three-Dimensional Approach:**

Self-Exploration: Encourage students to understand their interests, strengths, and values. Self-Advocacy: Empower students to articulate their needs and preferences in the university selection process. Informed Decision-Making: Guide students in making decisions based on a comprehensive understanding of their options.





## **Adaptability Across Grade Levels**

- Grade 9: Introduce basic concepts of self-exploration and the importance of future planning.
- Grade 10: Focus on identifying academic strengths and interests.
- Grade 11: Deepen exploration of university options and begin self-advocacy.
- Grade 12: Emphasize informed decision-making and finalizing university choices.

- **Collaborate with Experts** Invite USEF-Nepal representatives, consular officers, and international counselors to offer authentic information, ideally in the presence of guardians for collective decisionmaking.
- Utilize Virtual and In-Person Platforms -to provide students with comprehensive guidance on specific areas of the application process.
- **Explore Additional Opportunities** -Request sessions on application details and explore opportunities for summer camps or exchange programs.

#### **Key Initiatives in College Counseling**

- **1. AP Curriculum Implementation:** Integrating AP courses into the national curriculum to prepare students for studying abroad.
- **2. Student Opportunities:** Encouraging 9th-10th graders to apply for research and internship programs (Pioneer Academics, GPSI, LaunchX, nFactorial Incubator).
- **3.** Campus Visits: over the past year, visited about 25 college campuses abroad to match students with suitable institutions.
- **4. Innovative Platform:** Developing an AI-driven platform to help students plan, find fit universities, and achieve their goals with mentor support.

### **5.** Community Building:

- Established a regional college counselors community within a school network.
- Weekly online meetings to share expertise and support.
- Organizing seminars twice a year for CCs with experts from EducationUSA and university representatives.
