# Why is Parent Counseling important?

- Collaboration & teamwork is important - unified message for the student
- Opportunity to clarify roles in this process
- Opportunity to educate parents about the process
- Opportunity to message / dispel myths: we are the experts
- Addressing parent fears
- Opportunity to be proactive



# Benefits (and Limitations) of Parent Involvement in a Day School

- Easy access to parents benefits
  - Importance of partnering
  - education
- Easy access to parents limitations
  - Empowering students
  - Turning parents away from meetings
  - Staying in their lane
- Communication benefits & limitations
  - Prioritizing programming & messaging
    - Being all things to all parents
    - Equity
  - Myth-busting/limiting chatter benefits



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# Parent/Guardian Programming in a Day School (ASL)

- When to start
  - University advising needs to start earlier for parents than students
- What we do
  - A college counselor for parents a go-to person
    - Encouraging engagement with university advising easy link to book a meeting (15 minutes)
  - Cup of College monthly (for middle school 1xyr) in person or virtual
  - After hours discussion groups on topics bi-monthly involving deans and counselors as well, often targeted to pressure points in the year
  - Summer reads for parents most recently Never Enough, by Jennifer Breheny Wallace, followed by discussions
  - Parent Questionnaire: Next year: parent "compact" regarding roles
  - Including parents in student programming where appropriate
  - Senior Transition: "Letting Go" for parents
  - Communications:
    - Parent newsletter
    - Weekly Bulletin for students and parents
      - Articles to read
    - Emails

#### **Our Community**

Institut Le Rosey is a international independent co-educational boarding school in Switzerland that was established in 1880. Our student population is global both by passport and cultural experiences with over 60 nationalities on campus.

#### Limitations

- Dispersed parent community, globally
- Limited in-person contact
- Low participation in parent programming and events
- Reduced parent, unless issues arise
- Language and cultural barriers
- Dependency on technology for communicating
- Timing of parental input in the process



#### **Benefits**

- Consistent access to students
- Whole picture view of the students
- Focused student engagement
- Strong culture around post-secondary planning
- Global perspective
- Intermediary between student and parents
