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Shifting Sands: the Bahrain Context - Scholarships



Now in its 25th year. Vision is to develop young Bahrainis from all walks of life to take key positions in Bahrain's public and private sectors in the future. All expense paid education up to PhD. 750-800 apply (need 97% + pass psychometric assessment). Approx 110 qualify for the Candidacy Program. Was awarded to 10 students, from 2023, now up to 20 seats for Bahrainis only. Can study in 7 countries around the World <u>www.cpisp.bh</u>
