In that time, what has changed at Hamilton?

Test-Optional application, growth in application volume, international yield, selectivity

What has not changed? Really, almost everything

We are splitting hairs, and are mostly tied with all top 30 LACs

Part of the reason why we do not publish rankings on any materials



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Case Study Hamilton College

We don't publish or tout rankings, but there is an impact...

Admission Yield Rate, tied to ranking

Yield at top 10: 56% Yield at top 20: 41% Yield at top 15: 45%

Does this mean schools with fluctuations in ranking might be connected to changes in admission rates/waitlist ranges?



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Changes in methodology for **USWNR**

3 of top 10 LACs are now military focused- West Point, Airforce, Naval

Unchanged: 20% peer assessment, 5% consideration to testing average

Changed: eliminated first-gen graduation rate factor, transitioned to pell.

Pell incorporates only US citizens, whereas first-gen incorporates intl

Not considered: What percentage come from top percentages of HS, average class size, level of alumni giving, percentage of faculty with terminal degrees, and proportion of graduates with student loans

Course Highlights

No biology program is complete without **state-of-the-art research space**. The Natural Science Division maintains a **Central Instrument Facility** that houses extremely specialized instrumentation, which trains students on the skills required for graduate-level research or direct entry into the job market. Due to smaller class sizes, students have more extensive hands-on contact with these instruments and personal advising from professors.

Campus Life

The **Pre-Health Club** provides the support and guidance necessary to prepare for medical school and health professions.

The opportunities continue beyond the academic year at **the Bob and Mary Neher Station at Magpie Ranch**, the Biology Department's summer research field station in Montana.

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LMU'S EXPERIENCE WITH RANKINGS

Background: In 2019, LMU joins National Rankings at #64

- Increased application numbers from certain countries by 100% for Fall 2020
- Prior to US News National Ranking, LMU was ranked #3 in West Regional(?)

Post 2019:

- Starting 2021, saw a decline in applications from said countries
- This drop correlated with LMU losing ground in the national rankings (and Covid)

- Steady application rates and growth in applications
- What changed? Highlighting individual major rankings
 - Increase in applications for film production (#5 Hollywood reporter)
 - Increase in applications for business school
 - (#12 Entrepreneurship, #18 Marketing, #15 International Business)



- · Emphasizing post-graduate opportunities as ROI becomes more important
 - 98% of students are working or in graduate programs within 6 months
 - 2/3 of LMU students participate in at least one internship
 - Median early career salary \$77,000; mid-career: \$144,000
- Highlighting the benefits of studying in Los Angeles
 - Diversity in people and in industry; opportunities for internship and jobs
 - Weather, culture, beaches, etc.
